**Air Travel:** T.F. Green Airport (PVD) in Providence, RI is serviced by Delta Airlines, JetBlue, Southwest Airlines, United Airlines/United Airlines Express, and US Airways as well as a few regional carriers.

**Amtrak:** If you are traveling from the Northeast Corridor, Amtrak may be a viable option. The closest station to Newport is Kingston, RI. You will need to arrange for transportation from the Amtrak station to the hotel in advance. The best option is via Orange Cab.
